In ~~that outline~~ I stated that our plan involved amongst other work, a visit to ~~the~~ <sup>a group of</sup> Gikwas with whom we had worked intensively ~~for some~~ on our 1955 expedition to the central Kalahari.

On this visit we wished to clear up a few minor points ~~and of these~~, we also wished to get a few more pictures and <sup>for the purpose of checking possible common background between groups,</sup> let them hear ~~some~~ <sup>other</sup> recordings of ~~the~~ <sup>certain</sup> ceremonies used by other Bushman groups.

Owing to the fact that ~~among other~~ ~~the~~ reasons we found ~~our~~ <sup>that the</sup> work ~~up to~~ <sup>we have been doing up to now has</sup> taken longer than we anticipated, we ~~had~~ <sup>will have</sup> to leave the Gikwas for another time.

~~For this reason,~~ and for the purpose of the record ~~Recordingly,~~ I would like to withdraw the application I have ~~made~~ made for permission for our expedition to enter the Central Kalahari Game Reserve and ~~also~~ shall so state in my reports.

We will also have to ~~omit~~ <sup>postpone</sup> the work we planned in the Eastern part of Bechuanaland. We are leaving the Shangi district about November 9, ~~we~~ <sup>are</sup> going to ~~behave~~ <sup>planning to spend a</sup> Tsane and the Hottentot. ~~short time with the Hottentot and Bechuanaland groups in the Tsane region, again for background material.~~ We anticipate returning ~~the~~ <sup>and home</sup> Shangi en route to Windhoek ~~at~~ <sup>early</sup> in December.

What is known about the extent to which curiosity about matters other than "other peoples affairs", is prevalent in the various peoples of the earth.
