Mr. Laurence K. Marshall and his son, John, are planning a visit to South Africa for the purpose of photographing the bushmen rock engravings and such of the archeological culture and industry as may be feasible, using some special techniques for photographing the rock drawings in the field. They also hope to be able to obtain some pictures of native tribes engaged in their present forms of artistic expression with the thought to being able to help somewhat in determining if there is any correlation between any of the prehistory and present native culture.

After conferences at universities in Johannesburg, Pretoria, and Capetown the Marshalls plan to organize a small party and hope to be able to visit a number of localities in the southern half of the continent but particularly in the states of South West Africa and Bechuanaland.

If there is anything you can properly do to facilitate the Marshall's journey, they and I will be highly appreciative of your aid.

My dear John:

Your very kind letter of January should have been answered much sooner. I appreciate the kind comments about our recent flare up. There was much too much publicity about the whole thing, but it seemed there was no way of stopping it.

As you probably know, the basic difficulty was that the Navy felt that insufficient attention was being paid to the very difficult problem of getting supplies and troops over the ocean. I feel very strongly that unless the United States has the combatant ability to insure the freedom of the seas, the majority of our fighting in any future war will be done in this country. Primarily, this is because supplies and men must be landed in a combat area; otherwise all that can be done, even with planes of unlimited endurance and unlimited bomb-carrying capacity, is destroy; and destruction alone never settled a war. I think that the whole affair brought about a greater realization of the problems of national defense. The air has been clarified now, and I think that we have progressed much further towards a sounder system of national defense than we otherwise would have done. Admiral Sherman is doing a grand job as Chief of Naval Operations.

A good deal of the same problems which confront us have confronted you, too, I understand. I hope that your new Chief of Staff is satisfactory. I shouldn't be surprised but what I should have addressed you as the new Chief of Staff. It is difficult for people who have not been in military service recently to understand that a fighting Service must build up its spirit and its combatant ability under the gentle direction of topside, but without too much interference in the details of administration.

You are soon to have a visitor to South Africa whom I would like very much to have you meet. He is Mr. Laurence Marshall. He is a radar expert, and has recently retired as chairman of the Raytheon Corporation. He is doing very valuable work for the Research and Development Board, of which I am now Navy Secretary. He expects to leave the States on 17 May for several months' vacation in South Africa. Of course, an energetic man such as he is is not satisfied just to have a vacation, and while he is there I am sure that he will be interested in geology, photography and, very likely, the native culture of the area. He will have a car, and expects to travel through a great deal of South Africa. I have asked him to call you up when he arrives in Cape Town, since I am sure you will enjoy each other.

I think that I would appreciate very much your assistance in putting him in touch with the people at the Cape Town university who are interested in geology and native culture. I also would like to have him meet the

Honorable H. E. Gearing, who was mayor of Cape Town during my much too short visit; also, J. G. Carinus. I suppose that Merwyn B. Williams is still the town clerk, and perhaps Mr. Marshall would like to see him, too. Vice Adm. McCarthy has probably left Simonstown, but if he is still there I hope that you will give him my best the next time you see him.

Perhaps if Mr. Marshall stays in Cape Town long enough he would be interested in meeting some of those extremely nice people such as Betty Wentzel, Mary Armour, etc.

I received a letter not long ago from Juanita LeRoux. She says that she and Paddy Cook were now married and are now living in Cape Town. Please give them both my very best.

I am sure that the Naval Institute would be interested in an article on South African defense organization problems and other matters concerning your Armed Forces. If you would be interested in writing such an article, three to five thousand words, it would increase the understanding of our people of your problems.

There are very few Americans who know very much about South Africa. This is the main reason that I am anxious for Mr. Marshall to be in a position to learn as much as he can. Our countrys are very similar in many respects, but they are widely separated.

Please give my best regards to your family.

# ANOTHER CONVERT FOR DR. BROOM AND HIS MISSING LINK

**O**BVIOUSLY THE SOUTH AFRICAN fossil ape-man is the real precursor of man, says Professor Ernest A. Hooton, of Harvard University, in a letter to Dr. Robert Broom, whose discoveries in the Transvaal have made him world famous as the man who found the missing link.

Professor Hooton is generally regarded as America's leading anthropologist, and is probably the best-known anthropologist in the world.

In an interview with the Pretoria representative of The Star to-day Dr. Broom said that Professor Hooton was at one time cautious in accepting his claim to have found the missing link in South Africa.

## CONVINCED

"But he is now fully convinced. To-day, as far as I know, there are only two opponents in the world among anatomists, and one is already half won over to my views."

Professor Hooton was commenting on a memoir by Dr. Broom and Mr. J. T. Robinson on Plesianthropus (the South African fossil ape man).

"I have felt ever since the discovery of the first pelvis and the distal end of the femur that your case for the erect, bipedal and therefore essential human stance and taxonomic position of your fossils is irrefutable.

"I regret with you the tendency on the part of some anthropologists and anatomists to attempt to demonstrate to the acceptance of any important new finds which are not their own."

There could be no profit in quibbling about the alleged resemblance of this or that bone to the baboon or others, went on the letter.

## LIMERICK LEG PULL

"Obviously we have to deal with real precursors of man, who had already achieved human status in everything save, possibly, brain size. And your statement about the new mandible and the requisites of cranial capacity in a brain case that would fit it seems to extend the range of Plesianthropus well into the lower limits of forms indisputably human."

"When Professor Hooton published his well-known popular book on anthropology 'Up From the Ape' in 1946 he used the limerick form to pull my leg gently," said Dr. Broom. This is what he wrote:

Cried an angry she ape from  
Transvaal

"Though old Doctor Broom had  
the gall

To Christen me Plesianthropus,  
it's easy to see I'm not  
human at all."

# 300,000,000-Year-Old Petrified Forest Found in Kaokoveld

## *Fossil Tree Trunks 200 Feet Long; Mysterious Grave; Rock Paintings*

**S**OMEWHERE in the southern tip of the Kaokoveld, in South-West Africa, are archaeological treasures which few white men have seen, including a petrified forest, a mysterious grave and more rock paintings like that of the White Lady of the Brandberg.

With the opening up of this area for cattle-grazing the existence of these treasures has been brought to the notice of the South-West African Administration, which is greatly concerned about their preservation for posterity.

The Administrator, Colonel P. I. Hoogenhout, who is in Pretoria for routine consultations with the Government, recently visited the area. He told me to-day that he would recommend to the South-West Africa Executive Committee at an early date the proclamation of the area as a historical monument.

He described the petrified forest, which experts claim to be about 300,000,000 years old. He had not seen for himself the grave and the rock paintings, as they are situated in very rough country about ten miles beyond the forest.

There are tree trunks nearly 200 feet in length and perfectly straight with the branches cut off, giving the impression of having been felled by some human agency, he said.

According to experts, the trees must have been about 300 feet high before petrification. They very much resembled the Oregon pine. The grain was perfect and, in some cases, even the bark was petrified.

### **Natives Afraid.**

A farmer to whom grazing rights in the area had been granted told him of a mysterious grave, lined with stone and mortar, about which the Natives have superstitions. No Native can be found to go anywhere near it. One legend was that a White man with many diamonds lay buried there.

Some distance away there was a huge rock which appears to have been so shaped as to point to the grave.

Colonel Hoogenhout added that he had been told about places in the area in which there were rock paintings of the pre-Bushman culture similar to the White Lady in Brandberg.

Suggesting to the Administrator that the area should be protected, the farmer had said that people had visited the petrified forest in Jeeps and had taken away pieces of the fossils as souvenirs.

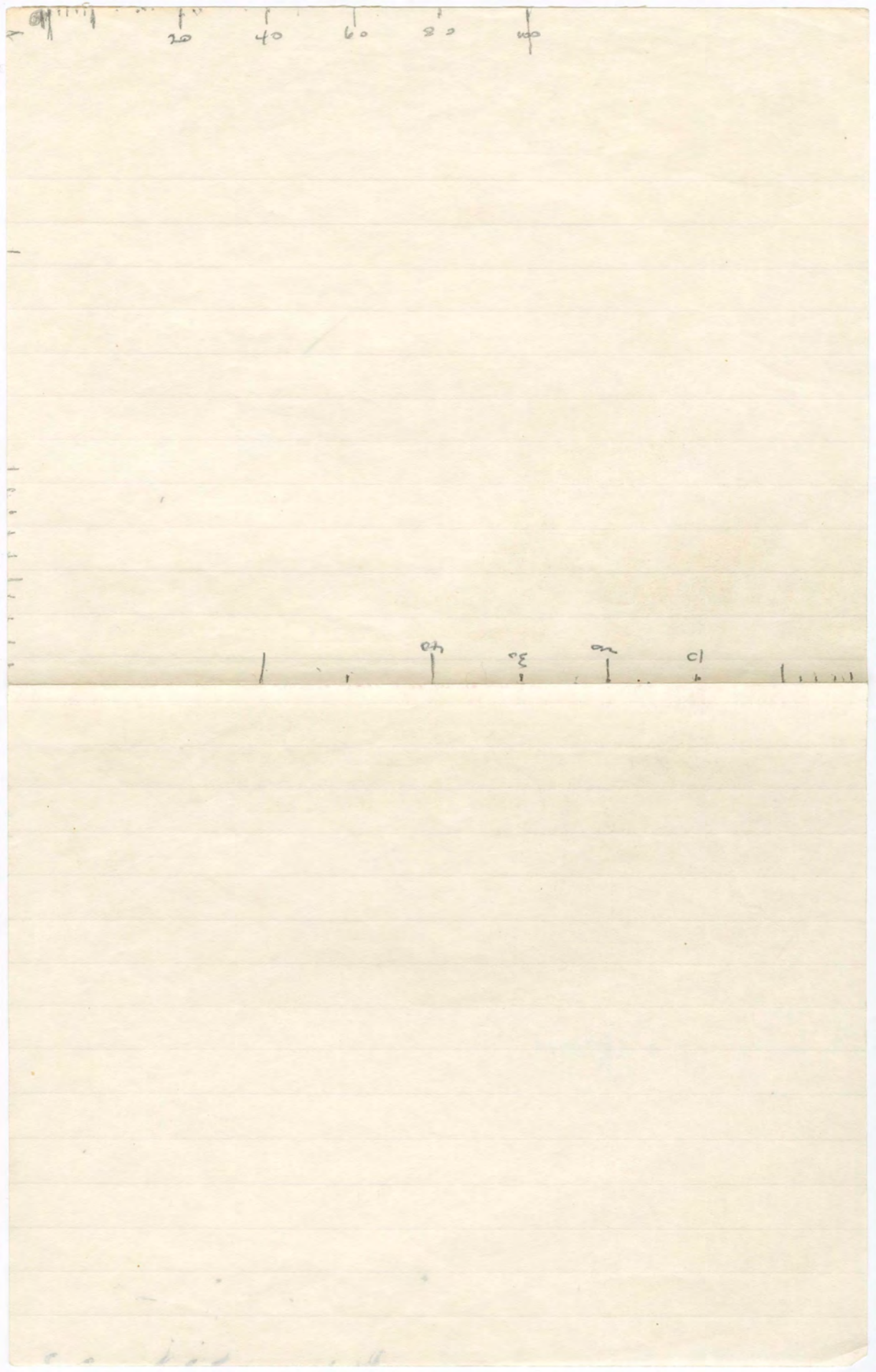
The Administrator said that he had issued strict instructions that no one should tamper with the grave, the rock paintings or the fossils.

Anybody who visited the area without a permit from the Administrator runs the risk of prosecution. To get to the area one has to pass a Native reserve which no European may enter without a permit.

Experts would be invited to visit the area.
